M.A. PROGRAM IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING

The Master of Art program in English Language Teaching is open to candidates with a BA or BS degree or its equivalent. Those candidates with no background in linguistics have to take without credit at least two of the courses in linguistics already offered by the Department of Humanities and receive at least BB in each course. The program includes several required and elective courses. The candidates have to take two required courses each semester. They also have to take four elective courses during their course of study. A thesis is obligatory. Exemption from the required courses and choice of the elective courses are subject to the approval of the candidate's advisor or their supervisor and the chairman of the department.

General Information: The fundamental goal of the Department of Humanities is to enrich the general culture of the student and to increase his intellectual capacity. There are five sections in the Department: Language; Literature; Linguistics; History; Logic, Philosophy and History of Science. Undergraduate elective courses are offered as well as programs leading to the degrees of Master of Arts in English Language Teaching and Master of Sciences and Doctor of Philosophy in Logic, Philosophy and History of Science.

English is taught to lead the students into scientific and cultural spheres through a universal medium. Turkish courses are given to foreign students. German, French and Arabic courses are offered for the benefit of those who would like to attain proficiency in a second language. The History, Literature, Linguistics, Logic, Philosophy and History of Science Sections offer courses, which broaden students' comprehension and ability to understand cultural developments and man's experiences. Particular emphasis is placed on the relationship between intellectual and humanistic studies and professional training. The Philosophy Section also offers courses for the teacher training program in the Department of Education.
